REUNION 2016

The Reunion did materialize and was the **EUROPEAN RIVER BOAT TRIP** on the Danube, Prauge to Budapest. Fourteen folks went on that trip, Elaine and I had to cancel at the last minute due to a bad knee. I will insert below a trip summary by Del Shelton.

2016 Prague & Danube River Cruise.

Delta Airlines computer problems that resulted in delayed flights and late delivery of luggage. We checked into a Park hotel, very nice home for the next 3 days. We got orientated by our program director "Lukas," and had dinner nearby. Day 2 we began exploring Prague which included the area of old town square to see gothic buildings, Charles 15th century bridge, and a large astronomical clock. Day 3 we visited an area called "Little Town," and the castle which overlooks Prague. Our last event was a meal and folk dancing and singing. As we departed to board the ship we stopped and enjoyed lunch, sights, and shopping at Cesky Kaumlov a medevil town. We joined our ship the River Aria and unpacked and had a great dinner.

We visited Salzburg on 8/13 via a tour and had lunch at the oldest (803) restaurant in Europe. We took funicular train to castle to see a great view of the city. They have some sights from the movie Sound of Music (gazebo, Cemetary). On 8/14 we toured the Melk Monastary over 800 years old, beautiful inside and out with over 2000 manuscripts. The Catheral was fantastic. We watched the scenery of the Wachu Valley go by from the upper deck of the boat as we sailed to Vienna.

On 8/15 we took a walking tour in Vienna. We learned about the ruling family Hapsburgs and their palaces. We saw a big cathedral called Stevie. A wall for protection around the city was torn down and a new horseshoe road was built and developed with nice buildings. We saw some of the famous Lepersani stallions in stables. During World War II the horses were taken to American forces to protect them during the war. After dinner, we went to a concert hall for a fantastic classical music concert.

8/16 we visited the Hapsburg Summer Palace and saw a few of the 1400 rooms. We watched the chef on our boat make apple struddle and he gave us a tour of his galley. We had evening entertainment in the lounge from Hungarian folk dancers. We departed for Bratislavia while eating dinner and saw the ship go the locks in the river. 8/17 Bratislavia was settled in 400 BC. We took a walking tour and ended at the main square and did some shopping. We visited a local family's home for tea and she shared how different it is now without communism. She can have colors, appliances, freedom, and traveling

8/18 Sailing all day today we saw a 16^{th} century Basilica. After lunch we set off on bus tour of Budapest and heard a great story of how some people helped 6,000 refugees in the city. We ended the day checking out the Market (food, Crafts, etc) in Budapest. Evening entertainment was by the ship staff.

8/19 We toured the Hospital in the Rock which helped care for over 600 soldiers during World War II. It was designed to handle only 100 patients. It even served as a nuclear fall-out shelter during the cold war. Back on board we enjoyed the elaborate Captain's Farewell Dinner.

8/20 The crew had early breakfast for us, before we left for airport to fly home. We loved this trip and what we saw and experienced.

Rocky Mountain National Park:

Georgetown: Steam train and silver mine tour. 1 hour round trip train ride. Broomfield to Georgetown is ~1 hour.
